- Readiness requirements that require special attention before departure to the theater of operations

Contingency Operations Personnel Planning Guidance page 2

- Have A DD Form 2766 (Adult Preventive And Chronic Care Flowsheet) Completed By The Medical Treatment Facility.
- No Permanent Physical Profile 3 And 4 Soldiers Deploy without:
 - MOS Medical Retention Board Clearance
 - Completion Of Medical Evaluation Board / Physical Evaluation Board Proceedings and Retention by PEB.



MILPER Message 01-248

Contingency Operations Personnel Planning Guidance page 3

- HIV screening per AR 600-110.
- DNA Specimen collected, noted on DD FORM 2766
- Immunizations required for the theater of operations.
 - If theater of operations is designated high threat area, all deploying soldiers will be compliant with the anthrax vaccine immunization program (AVIP).

Contingency Operations Personnel Planning Guidance

page 4

- Dental records contain a panograph.
- Dental class 3 & 4 who require treatment are not deployed until the treatment is completed.
- Orthodontist will evaluate orthodontic appliances for stability and inactivate the device before deployment.
- If these conditions cannot be met, the soldier will not deploy.

- DNA Specimen Collected / on File
- Immunizations
- Eyeglasses, Inserts
- Hearing Aid
- Medical Warning Tags
- Preventative Medicine Brief
- Medical Records Review
- Pregnancy test administered? Pregnant?
- Prescription 90 Day Supply



DA PAM 715-16 Contractor Deployment Guide

- Responsibility of Employer to Provide Qualified, Capable Personnel to Perform Contracted Duties.
- IDS/CRC Will Verify That Medical Requirements for Deployment Have Been Met :
 - screen contractor personnel records,
 - conduct theater specific briefings and training,
 - issue theater specific clothing and individual equipment,
 - Verify immunization, DNA screening, HIV testing and dental exam



DA PAM 690-47 DA CIVILIAN EMPLOYEE DEPLOYMENT GUIDE

- Physical Requirements Based on Functional Requirements of the Job in Theater and Specified by the In-theater Commander.
- Individual Must Be Physically Fit to Perform Assigned Duties,
- Ability to Meet Requirements Determined by Government Administered Physical Examination at the Home Station Prior to Deployment.



DoD 4500.54.G Foreign Clearance Guide

- Specifies Entry Requirements



AR 600-110 Identification, Surveillance, and Administration of Personnel Infected with HIV

- HIV tests are updated biennially for AD and every five years for RC
- Results will be posted in the medical record.
- HIV positive soldiers are non-deployable



HIV DEPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

- OCONUS >179 days
 - negative HIV test < 6 months prior to departure
- OCONUS <179 days
 - negative HIV test < 24 months prior to departure
- RC soldiers on active duty > 30 days
 - tested if > six months.
- Civilian Employees per DOD Foreign Service Clearance Guide /SOFA



Civilian HIV DEPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

- Civilian Employees per DOD Foreign Service Clearance Guide /SOFA
- DA policy (DA ODCSPER-G1/ OTJAG decision)
 - when a requirement exists for mandatory HIV screening, and the test is positive, a civilian can be deployed in support of a contingency operation as long as the host country is notified and the individual is able to perform assigned duties.



AR 40-501 STANDARDS OF MEDICAL FITNESS

- 8–18. Mobilization of units and members of Reserve Components of the Army
 - A current periodic medical examination or a new medical examination is not required incident to mobilization or call-up for war or contingency operations.



AR 40-501 STANDARDS OF MEDICAL FITNESS

- 5–14. Medical fitness standards for certain geographical areas
 - a. All soldiers considered medically qualified for continued military status and medically qualified to serve in all or certain areas of the continental United States (CONUS) are medically qualified to serve in similar or corresponding areas outside the continental United States (OCONUS).



Theater Specific Requirements

- Combatant Commanders Guidance in:
 - Warning Order
 - Alert Order
 - Deployment Order
- MILPER Messages
 - A mission specific message will be published to provide unique processing requirements associated with an individual operation.



Soldier Readiness Processing Concept of the Operation

- Deploying Units Arrive SRP Site
- Check in With the SRP Staff With Soldier Readiness Processing Folder.
- Briefed on the Process of the SRP.
- Soldiers Grouped, Sent to Processing Stations.
- SRP Complete When Soldier Has Completed All Stations and Checked Out With SRP Staff.



Deploying Unit

- Provides a Unit Roster to SRP Coordinator
- Provides Movement Control of Soldiers During Processing
- Provides Police Call Detail

Medical Station Process Overview

- MEDPROS record reviewed and compared with Medical Record.
- DD Form 2795, Pre-Deployment Health Assessment completed
- Positive responses referred to medical provider for further evaluation.
- HIV, Immunization, DNA, Pregnancy tests, Earplug fitting, Dental exams, Eyeglasses and inserts updated.



MEDDAC & DENTAC Commanders:

- Request Personnel & Resources From Installation as required.
- Coordinate With SRP Coordinator
- Provide Exams and Treatment to Soldiers As Required.
- Provide Readiness Statistics report to Installation SRP Coordinator every 8 hours



Medical Personnel Requirements

Medical Personnel:	8 hours	24 hours
– OIC (1 per 8 hr shift)	1	3
– NCOIC (1 per 8 hr shift)	1	3
– Physicians (3 per 8 hr shift)	3	9
– Nurses (3-4 per 8 hr shift)	4	12
– Medics (22 per 8 hr shift)	22	66
– Admin (2 per 8 hr shift)	2	6
– Copier staff	1	3
Total	34	102



Dental Personnel Requirements

- Personnel Requirements 8 hours 24 hours
 - Dental Officers: 3 per shift 3 9
 - Dental Assistants: 3 per shift 3 9
 - Records Personnel : 2 per shift 2 6
 - Admin: 2 per shift 2 6
