**MEMORIAL PROGRAMS**

1. File this supplement in front of the publication for reference purposes.

2. AR 1-33, 15 December 1980, is supplemented as follows:

Page 2, paragraph 3a, Applicability. Add the following:

This supplement is applicable to all organizations, agencies, activities, and units assigned, attached, or stationed at Fort Sam Houston and Camp Bullis.

Page 2, paragraph 6c(2), Responsibilities. Add the following:

(a) The Fort Sam Houston Memorialization Board is established to review all memorialization requests affecting facilities at Fort Sam Houston or Camp Bullis and to make recommendations to the Commander, U.S. Army Medical Department Center and School and Fort Sam Houston, concerning proposed memorialization requests. Memorialization actions will be considered as "undertakings" in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and are therefore subject to review by the Directorate of Public Works, Environmental and Natural Resources Division.

(b) The Memorialization Board will be chaired by the Chief, Museum Division, Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security, and will include the Director, U.S. Army Medical Department Center and School, Museum, and representatives of the Directorate of Public Works and the Directorate of Community Activities.

(c) The Memorialization Board will meet quarterly or as required, to consider memorialization requests by agencies, activities, and units at Fort Sam Houston and Camp Bullis.


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(d) Organizations, agencies, activities, and units which are located at Fort Sam Houston and Camp Bullis may request the memorialization of the facilities, buildings, or areas in which they are located. Memorialization requests at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, will be forwarded to the Memorialization Board, ATTN: MCGA-PTM-M, for consideration. Requests will identify the facility, building, or area affected; the full name of the individual to be memorialized; and justification for the memorialization. The request should also include a description and proposed text for any plaque, marker, or signage to be used. The Memorialization Board will review the request IAW the criteria in the basic regulation and make a recommendation to the Commander, U.S. Army Medical Department Center and School, to approve or disapprove the requested memorialization action.

(e) The Commander will announce approved actions IAW paragraph 9 of the basic regulation.

(f) Organizations, agencies, activities, and units requesting the memorialization action will be responsible for any cost associated with plaques, markers, or signage indicating the memorialization.
