ORGANIZATIONAL INSPECTION PROGRAM

1. PURPOSE. This regulation delineates the policy of the Academy of Health Sciences, U.S. Army (AHS) for the command's Organizational Inspection Program (OIP).

3. APPLICABILITY. This regulation applies to all activities of the Academy to include U.S. Army Medical Equipment and Optical School (USAMEOS), the U.S. Army School of Aviation Medicine (USASAM) and the AMEDD Noncommissioned Officers Academy.

4. POLICY.

a. The Commandant will ensure that the organization follows regulatory requirements. The assessment of regulatory compliance involves initiating maximum integration of the three major components of the OIP: the command inspection program (CIP), staff inspections, and Inspector General (IG) inspections.

(1) The CIP is the responsibility of the Commander, Academy Brigade. The Brigade Commander will develop a CIP that complies with the provisions of AR 1-201, will complement the battalion commander's program, and will prevent redundant inspections.

(2) Staff Inspections.

(a) Brigade level staff inspections are compliance oriented and should complement command and IG inspections. Command inspection team members may include Brigade or Directorate staff members thereby reducing the number of inspections.

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(b) The Assistant Commandant and/or the U.S. Army Health Service Command staff will conduct Academy Directorate level staff inspections.

(3) Inspector General Inspections.

(a) The AHS IG will conduct inspections that focus on issues affecting the Academy. Those issues may be the result of the Commandant's areas of interest, audit reports, review of the Brigade's command inspection reports, or other elements.

(b) The AHS IG will conduct inspections IAW AR 20-1 and TBIG 1

b. The Assistant Commandant, along with the AHS Inspector General, will coordinate and monitor the AHS OIP. This also includes monitoring and coordinating internal/external inspections and audits. All directorates must be cognizant and alert relative to proposed inspections and/or audits by an agency other than HSC. Reference 2d requires the Commandant to notify Commander, HSC, ATTN: HSOP-SO within three calendar days of receipt of notification of such an inspection or audit. Therefore, all directors and commanders will notify the central AHS point of contact, the office of the AHS Inspector General **IMMEDIATELY** upon learning of a proposed inspection and/or audit by any agency other than AHS or HQ, HSC.

c. The Academy Brigade and the Academy Directorates will provide the AHS Inspector General results of all external and internal inspections and audits within two working days of receipt of such an inspection or audit.
